The summer is winding down and fall is in the air. Even so there are still plenty of boating days to enjoy. Not only are we looking forward to the frost bite cruise but to the scenery around the bay as the leaves change color.

My time as your R/C is winding down and I must say I have had a great time working with everyone maintaining the grounds of our great club. I can't thank everyone enough for your help and dedication for all you do. I know you will do the same for Brian as he takes over,

Last year as I took over the position of R/C I asked everyone to keep track of their hours and send them to me. Some did not like the idea but the hours kept coming in. The whole

idea was to find out what it takes to keep the club running. Remember this is only reported time, there were many more hours not reported such as time working special events and projects or just doing odds and ends to keep our club in the great shape it is. There were over 5400 hours reported which equates to 134 man weeks or 2 1/2 years for 1 person. Beautification day we had 60 sign the attendance sheet, at 5 hours each that equates to 300 hours or 7 1/2 weeks for 1 person. If we were to pay \$15.00 an hour to someone to do all this work it would cost \$85,500.00. So give yourselves a big round of applause, you deserve it.

This last weekend when I took some trash to the dumpster what I saw inside upset me very much. In someone's trash were 6 small American Flags. I dug this trash out of the dumpster and removed the flags so they could be disposed of properly.

As a revered symbol of freedom and justice, the flag of the United States of America needs to be treated with the utmost respect. This respect extends to the flag's eventual retirement and destruction. The United States Flag Code (4 USC Sec 8 Para (k) Amended 7 July 1976) states: "The Flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem of display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning.

FLAG DISPOSAL:

- 1. The flag should be folded in its customary manner.
- 2. It is important that the fire be fairly large and of sufficient intensity to ensure complete burning of the flag.
 - 3. Place the flag on the fire.
 - 4. The individual(s) can come to attention, salute the flag, recite the Pledge of Allegiance and have a brief period of silent reflection.
 - 5. After the flag is completely consumed, the fire should then be safely extinguished and the ashes buried.
 - 6. Please make sure you are conforming to local/state fire codes or ordinances.

You can take old Flags to a VFW, American Legion, give them to the Boy or Girl Scouts of America, the US Military, or give them to me.

A Bit of Nautical background

Before the mast

Literally, the area of a ship before the foremast (the forecastle). Most often used to refer to men whose living quarters are located here, officers being quartered in the stern-most areas of the ship (near the quarterdeck). Officer-trainees lived between the two ends of the ship and become known as "midshipmen". Crew members who started out as seamen, then became midshipmen, and later, officers, were said to have gone from "one end of the ship to the other"

(also see hawsepiper).


